TLC Home Group Expectations

- Please start and end on time. If you'd like to provide an atmosphere of fellowship, it's better that you
 provide this at the end to allow people who have to leave the opportunity to do so.
- Allow silence. Allow room for others to contemplate and even feel uncomfortable when asking someone to read, within group prayer, or when throwing out a question. Please don't rush in just to fill the space. Allow God to do what only He can.
- When sharing, make it about you and what God is revealing about you and or Him. Please allow room for others to share (don't dominate).

"THROUGH THE WORKING OF HIS POWER" Ephesians 3:1-13

This passage is a **chiasm**: a literary tool to **highlight what's at the center**...

Let's walk through this chiasm...

Idea A: **Suffering on behalf of someone else.** Read Eph 3:1 and 3:13. Have someone in your group read Matthew 5:10-12

- Are you <u>excited</u> to **suffer** for Jesus, whether in **smaller ways** (fighting sin/killing the flesh, changing your
 habits/entertainment/daily rhythms) or **bigger things** (losing
 friends/jobs, potential physical persecution)?
- In what areas of your life have you seen/experienced this?
- What areas of life could you press further into, to experience more of what Jesus promises?

Idea B: **God revealing/making things known.** Read Eph 3:2-3 and 3:10-12.

Sometimes God <u>does</u> reveal things to us about our past experiences: why we experienced what we did, how He worked in it, how He made you more steadfast through it, etc...

- How can you look back and clearly see God's faithfulness in harder times in your life, that you couldn't see in the moment?
- Idea C: **God hiding/**not making things known. Read Eph 3:5 and 3:9. Sometimes God does not reveal everything we want to know about our past experiences right away (or ever)...
 - How much peace do you have with the unknown (past, present, or future)? How does this reflect your level of trust in God?

Idea D: What is revealed: Gentiles are included with Christ. Read Eph. 3:6 and 3:8b.

Biblical hospitality is "love of strangers." God has done this with us.

How quick are you to welcome new people into your <u>life</u>?

Idea E: God's gift of grace to Paul: he's tasked to preach what is revealed. Read Eph. 3:7a and 3:8b.

 Do you see Christian leadership as a "gift of God's grace" or a burden you're scared of? TLC and Cape May County have countless places that need your help. Where could you eagerly enter (or move deeper) into servant-leadership?

** Idea F [main idea]: God's greatness and man's weakness**. Read the following (Eph. 3:7b-8a): "...through the working of his power. Although I am the least of all the Lord's people..."

Read Gen. 1:27-31. Notice all that God gives to mankind to show their dependence, and how this **dependence on God is "very good."**

- Do you see humanity's natural, pre-fall, God-designed dependence on God as "very good"?
- How has God shown off in your life through your weaknesses?
