AWORD FROM PASTOR GARY

NOW

In Joshua 18 there were seven tribes that hadn't received their inheritance within the promised land. There are potential reasons for why they hadn't taken what God was giving them: a lack of faith, courage or maybe they were settling for the nomadic life they've grown accustom to. God challenged them with the question of "how long will you wait before you begin to take possession of the land". The question is a valid question based on God's promise to give them the land and provisions to do so. The Hebrew word for "wait" means relax or neglect. So, the question is: "Why are you neglecting or relaxed about yielding to what God has for you?" In Acts 22, The Apostle Paul was preaching about the transforming supernatural power of God. He used his conversion experience in Damascus as an example of this power. In this experience, God used Ananias to communicate that Paul was chosen by God to know His will, see the Righteous One, hear His words and to be a witness of all he's seen and heard. After Ananias challenged him with the mission he asked, "And now what are you waiting for? Get up, be baptized and wash your sins away, calling on his name". My observation is that God is waiting more for us to get up and move more than we are for Him!

When we enter into a relationship with God through Jesus, we become citizens of and belong to the kingdom of God (John 3). Those that are born again are given the ability to see and enter the kingdom of God. We've been chosen by God to know Him, His will, to be a witness (Acts 1:8) to all we've seen and heard and to make disciples. In what places or areas in your life might God be asking you why you're waiting to move where He's clearly directing you?

FROM PASTOR GARY

It might be within designating more significant time with God, being intentional within those in your web of influence who don't know Jesus, reconciling a relationship, being present, communicating gratitude and thanksgiving, making the phone call, writing the note, making the invite, or circling back around. Could the area that God might be challenging you on be around your role within His church? God's given you gifting, skills, and talents to edify the Body. In the Old Testament God called on skilled musicians (1 Chronicles 25) to lead the way. When building the tabernacle God used skilled workers and designers (Exodus 36). In 1 Chronicles 25 the musicians are described as trained and skilled, young and old alike. So, this tells us God can and desires to use us and at any age. God desires to move His unmistakable supernatural transforming power through you and us as His church. Are you neglecting or relaxed about yielding to what God has for you NOW? If tomorrow isn't guaranteed, God's promises are true and will never fail, you have the spirit of Christ in you and He's promised to be with you, what are you waiting for? My challenge for us individually and as a body is to allow the Spirit to stir a sense of urgency about today. I'm not encouraging us to run ahead of God. I'm encouraging us to live today wisely by making the most of every opportunity and it starts **NOW**.



MULTICULTURAL OUTREACH

Multicultural ministries has reached out to a variety of people over the course of this year. HOME GROUPS

In 2023-2024, TLC had 14 Home Groups consisting of 35 facilitators, 26 host homes, and 255 participants attending a group at least three times. We focused on four Biblical doctrines with associated scriptures as our topics for discussion: God, Sin, Justification, and the Holy Spirit. The guides included questions to prompt reflection and discussion on what we are called to do in light of these doctrines and how this understanding impacts our daily walk as Christians. It was evident that many groups grew deeper in their relationships and cared for one another well.

MEN'S MINISTRY

The mission of the Men's Ministry at The Lighthouse Church is to create an atmosphere where men can develop Godly characteristics through accountability and relationships in order to influence their world for Jesus Christ.

WOMEN'S MINISTRY

Women ministering to women through various groups to encourage deeper relationships with God and each other, providing Bible centered teaching, prayer and encouragement for spiritual growth.



VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

2024 THEME: SCUBA: Diving into Friendship with Jesus

Vacation Bible School was held August 4th-8th in the evenings. The children started and ended in a whole group setting where they worshipped God as one body, singing and dancing to songs such as "Joy" by For King and Country and "Praise" by Elevation Worship. During these opening and closing times, we offered an update on the mission project, raising money to further the THRIVE Ministry. The rotations included a Deep Bible Adventure, an immersive, and sometimes interactive, telling of key parts of the Bible. There was Imagination Station: a science-centered approach to having children connect to the qualities God exhibits as a friend to us; this was a **very** popular rotation! Children also created a keepsake painting, after learning how to access God's word through a rotation called Sticky Scripture. Each child took home either a Gospel of John, designed for younger learners, or a New Testament. This rotation gave children the chance to open, read from, and learn how to use a Bible. Each day we took them through a section of John and tied in the Bible point for the day.

GRIEFSHARE

GriefShare has been growing steadily with each 13-week cycle, leading us to add multiple GriefShare groups. GriefShare is a huge community outreach opportunity as 90-95% of the participants are not from TLC. Many are non-believers, and we have had people come to faith, get baptized and join our church family—God is faithful!

Each of the three facilitators we have came to us as grievers themselves, and were profoundly helped by the GriefShare curriculum. As a result, they wanted to give others what they had been given. A number of people from Lighthouse signed up to join us in the same mindset: to walk wisely and well with those struggling with the loss of a loved one, and point them to the hope and healing found in a relationship with God through Jesus.

THRIVE

THRIVE launched in Fall 2023 after the staff recognized a need within the community for a program that comes alongside grieving children and youth. A few weeks into struggling to write our own curriculum, we partnered with two other churches who were actively running child and youth grief programs. Three individuals finished the first cycle of THRIVE, and a total of six finished the second. As the second cycle came to a close, we took a leap of faith and decided to prepare to offer a THRIVE Summer Camp: a 3-day camp focused on hope and healing in Jesus with a variety of off-site activities. The camp was held in mid-August with 15 volunteers and

27 campers, and we partnered with members of the congregation, Cape May County Zoo, No Limits Academy, and other local organizations to create an unforgettable week. We are excited to see how the Lord continues to use THRIVE in Cape May County.



DIVORCE CARE

DivorceCare is a healing ministry that strives to help hurting hearts and minds through Jesus Christ. Healing from divorce is a slow-moving process, which results in attendees needing to go through the 13-week cycle two to three times. As we strive to change the stigma around divorce, our prayer is that those who attend the sessions for healing naturally evolve into divorce leaders who can walk alongside others. Generally, women are more open to attend. This year, however, we have had more men take the leap of faith and next steps to heal. We are excited to help these men and women heal so they do not carry the brokenness of their past relationships into future relationships.

LIFE RECOVERY

Life Recovery had an awesome year! God allowed five individuals who have been faithful for 6 months to a year to commit to becoming a part of the leadership team. Two have facilitated meetings throughout the year, while others have been a blessing behind the scenes, such as recording the attendance, and keeping bins stocked with coffee, water and snacks. We have seen many miracles and blessings throughout the year of individuals applying the 12 Steps and 12 Scriptures to their everyday lives and staying the course. They have told us of how the Lord has blessed them, such as getting their own place to being able to sleep at night. We have seen Atheists come in and give their life to God. The group has become a family in so many ways, including dining, attending worship events, doing activities, and praying together. We are excited to see the Lord continue to work through this group in the upcoming year!

HOSPITALITY TEAM

The Hospitality Team leads in fostering an environment that embodies warmth and care, helping to make every individual feel seen and valued, and pointing them towards a relationship with a loving God. Biblical hospitality is not just a task or a role, it's a position of the heart and a culture we build.

WELCOME TEAM & USHERS

The Welcome Team is the welcoming face of our congregation, helping to create a warm and inviting atmosphere for all who enter. Their primary role is to greet attendees with a smile, assist newcomers with information about services and programs, and provide support as needed. Their presence helps foster a sense of community and belonging, making everyone feel valued and seen as they join us for worship and fellowship.

The Ushers play an important role in ensuring that the service is welcoming, comfortable, and runs smoothly for the members and visitors. They escort individuals to open seats with a smile, and answer any questions that come up.

SAFETY TEAM

The Safety Ministry hosted Stop-the-Bleed and CPR/AED/First Aid training for volunteers across several TLC ministries.
Safety Ministry also participated in FBSN's Church Security and Safety Conference in northern Philadelphia.



COUNSELING 30

COUNSELING MINISTRY

The Counseling Ministry is going into its fifth year and is based on the knowledge that as Christians, the Bible is our authority and drives our understanding of the human heart and its deep motivations. Biblical counselor, Maria Sonntag, is committed to using God's word as the source of wisdom to address personal struggles as well as marriage and family issues for hope, understanding and true healing. By drawing those in need into a deeper relationship with God to better grasp His love, grace, and forgiveness in Christ, believers are equipped to live life with hope in a fallen world filled with disappointments and temptations.

True change is not merely behavioral, but generates from deep within the heart, and transformation is accomplished by the power of the Holy Spirit. We are saints being progressively sanctified.

There are currently 25 people being seen for Biblical counseling. The paradigm for our church-based counseling is an average of six sessions and then an evaluation to determine the need to continue or perhaps reduce the frequency of visits. Only those in "crisis" (a need evaluated by the Counselor) are seen weekly. The goal is not to remain in counseling indefinitely, but to widen the counselee's connection to fellowship within the church body such as through Home Groups, Bible Study and especially getting involved themselves in serving others.

PRAYER MINISTRY

WE BELIEVE PRAYER IS THE PRIMARY WORK OF GOD'S PEOPLE! The Prayer Ministry continues to persevere with our faithful "pray-ers." We currently gather at the church an hour before the Sunday service begins to pray and invite the Spirit to fall afresh on our worship, that it would be pleasing and glorifying to God.

We also greet people and pray for them in the sanctuary. So many Godordained interactions (no matter how brief) have blessed us and those we get to pray with! This is especially true for our time of "Altar prayer" at the end of the service, where folks are invited to come up and bring their prayer requests to be lifted to the throne room of grace.

The prayer team also attends church events such as holiday outreaches and provides prayer guides as needed, as well as invites people to join the team, and provides training on a continuing basis.

WORSHIP AND SIGHT & SOUND TEAMS

Worship at the Lighthouse Church has experienced transition over the last year, but we have seen the heart of our church and teams remain focused on Jesus through it all. We continue to see the quality of our services improve as we strive to point people to Christ. Our goals for the Sight, Sound, and Praise teams continue to be to remove distractions, pursue excellence, and point people to Jesus. Part of our plan for accomplishing these goals includes creating a more cohesive gathering time which is consistent and excellent on a regular basis. This includes providing intentional training opportunities for volunteers, developing higher quality organization for our teams, and improving the equipment and space we gather in, to praise the Lord.

A major aspect of this includes rearranging how we utilize our worship space. We believe that there are better ways to use the building that we have been granted, which will provide additional options for fellowship, as well as provide a more consistent environment for corporate worship. By shifting services into the current gymnasium, we are able to provide a more cohesive space. To be clear, we are not dismantling the gym, as we believe it provides a great space to invite believers and unbelievers in through various functions. Instead, each portion of the new service space will be specifically designed for easy removal. At the same time, this provides the opportunity to shift the current worship space into a true fellowship hall, where we can gather together. These adjustments will take time to implement and finalize, but we believe this will ultimately serve to help reach our goals of pointing people to Jesus with minimal distractions.

COMMUNITY CARES TEAM

The Community Cares Team at The Lighthouse Church is essentially a team of people who are actively looking to be the hands and feet of Christ. Our goal is to help meet the emotional, financial, and physical needs of the congregation. Over the last fiscal year, our team has received many applications, referrals, and word of mouth needs from our congregation. We have provided multiple financial gifts to families in medical crisis along with gift baskets to those currently going through medical procedures. We have also provided community resources to help meet personal family needs, along with notes of encouragement to those in need. Our vision for the future is to expand our team, to continue to help those in need, and become more aware of congregation needs through the prayer ministry.
