Jesus
Luke 1:1-4

Luke 1:1-4 is the introduction to the entirety of the gospel of Luke and the “why” of this writing. The author is indicating that “many” have undertaken drawing up an account of things **fulfilled**. Some scholars believe there are more than 300 prophecies about Jesus in the Old Testament in reference to Jesus' birth, ministry, death and resurrection, and his role in the church. Explore the Old Testament and find a prophecy about Jesus’:

- Birth
- Ministry
- Death and resurrection
- Role in the church

What does **prophecy** tell us about God and why is it important?

The author communicates that he **carefully investigated everything**.

- Talk about ways we can carefully investigate who Jesus is.
- Why is it important to investigate from the beginning?
- What questions are important in the pursuit of investigating Jesus?
- How are you carefully investigating who Jesus is?

The author wrote to ensure that the reader might **know** the **certainty of Jesus**.

- If you had to introduce someone to Jesus in thirty - sixty seconds, how would you do it?
- Who has God put in your path currently that you are actively introducing Jesus to? How are you doing so?
